On November 5, 2013, the JCC dismissed a complaint filed against a district court judge who included comments in the certification of a motion to disqualify. The JCC found that the misconduct was troubling but relatively minor misbehavior for which no public sanction was warranted.

In March 2012, the JCC issued two dismissals with warnings, both arising from the same complaint, to a justice court judge who had engaged in ex parte communications. The JCC found that the misconducts were troubling but relatively minor misbehavior for which no public sanction was warranted. The complainant requested that the investigations be reopened, and the JCC granted that request. After a criminal trial against the judge resulted in acquittal, and after additional investigation and consideration, the JCC determined that the original dismissals with warnings were appropriate.
