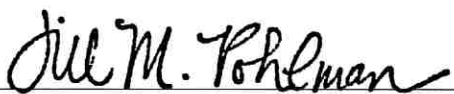
ORDER

ORDER OF CENSURE

The Judicial Conduct Commission authorized its staff to negotiate the terms of and enter into a written Stipulation for discipline by consent in this matter. The Stipulation has been signed and approved by the Commission's Executive Director and the Hon. William Kendall. The stipulation sets forth facts and conclusions that support both the finding of judicial misconduct and the issuance of a censure.
